We can assist you by email and phone with responding to questions and providing you with information regarding processes and the appropriate forms. The necessary court forms can be found, downloaded and completed on line. From our website at [www.shasta.courts.ca.gov](http://www.shasta.courts.ca.gov), go to the “Forms & Filing” tab and and then choose “Judicial Council Forms.” A drop down menu will appear which will allow you to pick the appropriate subject matter. Once you have chosen the subject click on “See Forms.” You can complete these forms on line and save and/or print them. Under “Forms & Filing” you will also find the option of Local Forms which contains additional forms specific to Shasta County.

We can review forms submitted to us for completeness. You can email us forms to review, or alternatively, documents (originals with copies and a self-addressed, stamped return envelope) can be mailed to us at 1500 Court Street, Room 115, Redding, CA 96001, or delivered to the drop box labeled Self Help Center provided in the public lobby.

If you require assistance with completing your case, we can work with you and prepare the appropriate paperwork which we can email or mail to you for your signature.
