THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Due to a major flooding event, causing significant damage and forcing the courthouse to close, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Shasta. Upon the request of Presiding Judge Tamara L. Wood, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Shasta County is authorized to do the following:

- Transfer civil cases pending trial to a superior court in any county, with the consent of all parties to the case, from May 13, 2025, to May 23, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(2)(A));
- Declare that from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, if the above-described emergency conditions substantially interfere with the public's ability to file papers in a court facility on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(4));
- Declare that from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825 and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 334, 631, 632, 637, and 657, if the above-described emergency conditions prevent the court from conducting proceedings or accepting filings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(5));
- Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than five (5) days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(6));
- Extend by not more than seven (7) days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from May 12, 2025, to May 18, 2025, inclusive, because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine

whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(7));

- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(9)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(10)).

SUPERIOR COURT OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF SHASTA

GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the May 12, 2025, Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Patricia Guerrero, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Shasta County ("Court") on this same date, this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Any judge of the Court may transfer civil cases pending trial to a superior court in any county, with the consent of all parties to the case, from May 13, 2025, to May 23, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(2)(A));
- 2. For purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, the Court finds and declares that the period from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive, be deemed holidays, as the above-described emergency conditions have substantially interfered with the public's ability to file papers in a court facility on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(4));
- 3. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825 and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 334, 631, 632, 637, and 657, the Court finds and declares that the period from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive, be deemed holidays, as the above-described emergency conditions prevented the court from conducting proceedings or accepting filings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(5));
- 4. Any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than five (5) days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(6));

- 5. The duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from May 12, 2025, to May 18, 2025, inclusive, are extended by seven (7) days because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(7));
- 6. Any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(9)); and
- 7. Any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 12, 2025, to May 16, 2025, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115, subd. (a)(10)).

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
